The learners explored two exhibitions - 'Visible and Invisible', where they participated in a workshop and created collages, and 'What the Camera Didn't See', focusing on photography. Guided by a curator, they examined various art forms, from traditional to contemporary, and were prompted to consider thought-provoking questions. PBL SESSION WITH ARCHITECT NISHITA BHATIA

Our Early Years learners recently engaged in an immersive problem-based learning initiative centered around geography and architecture. Under the guidance of architect Nishita Bhatia, EY 1 learners brought landforms to life using clay, leaves, and paper cut-outs. Meanwhile, EY 2 learners crafted mini monuments with bricks, and EY 3 learners designed dream rooms on mood boards, incorporating magazine pictures and drawings. Our EY 2 learner Saisha shared a souvenir from her visit to the Konark Sun Temple. The learners were thrilled to examine the temple's intricate carvings firsthand, gaining valuable insights into monument beautification. Ms. Bhatia's expertise proved invaluable in enhancing the learners' learning experience, sparking curiosity through these multisensory activities. This hands-on learning approach not only fostered creativity but also promoted collaboration and problem-solving skills.









INTERNATIONAL SOCIAL STUDIES OLYMPIAD

Our learners competed in the Social Studies Olympiad, an international event that tested participants' knowledge of history, geography, civics and current affairs. The competition challenged learners to analyze complex topics and apply theoretical concepts. Competitors from around the world showcased their analytical thinking and social studies skills in this contest.





PERSONAL PROJECT ORIENTATION

An informative presentation was held for IB MYP learners on their Year-5 Personal Project.
